

Downloading from Sphinx's FTP Site

FTP (File Transfer Protocol) is a method for transferring large files via the internet. FTP is a direct connection that does not rely on Internet Service Providers (ISP). AS a result, FTP is not subject to the size limits imposed by IPS's. FTP utilizes validation so that large files will be transferred correctly.

Instructions for downloading from Sphinx's FTP site (from a high speed connection):

From your browser, enter <ftp://70.154.214.194>

You should see a "Log On As" dialogue box.

Enter:	Username:	<i>cleopatra</i>	All lower case letters
	Password:	<i>lovers</i>	

You will see multiple folders. Click on the appropriate folder. You will then see files here.

NOTE - in some cases, you will not see the actual folders. Instead, you will see:

FTP root at 70.154.214.194

To view this FTP site in Windows Explorer, Click **Page**, and then click **Open FTP Site in Windows Explorer**.

The **Page** button is in the upper right corner. You may be asked to enter login and/or password again. This is normal.

Once you see the files, DO NOT Double click on the files. Instead, right click and either "Copy to Folder" or "Copy and Paste" to your computer. You may highlight multiple files to speed up the process.

Then, once the files are copied to your computer, double click to view.
